

James Hill, Ransom Canyon Police Chief and Elena Quintanilla, City Manager presented information regarding the Emergency Road, which is accessible for South Lake Shore residents in case of Fire or flooding over the spillway.

The Emergency gate, which entrances Buffalo Springs, will be open when the spillway is closed. Two posts and chain will show the road is closed, and will be monitored 24 hours daily, by the Police Dept.

Residents need a sticker and Ransom Canyon pass to utilize the emergency road. If you do not have yours, please call James Hill - 829-2600.

There is no walking allowed, on the new road, unless it is during an emergency. This is Buffalo Springs territory, and unless you have a "yearly pass for Buffalo Springs", you will be trespassing, and charged for "Theft of Service".

When an Emergency is in effect, the City of Ransom Canyon will send out an email as will the POA email. Be sure the POA & Ransom Canyon Police have your email to be notified

FYI - The local news agencies and the Sheriff's Dept. will be notified of the emergency exit being open when this occurs. We are pleased these new procedures are in place and we are especially thankful for the "technology in reaching so many so quickly".
